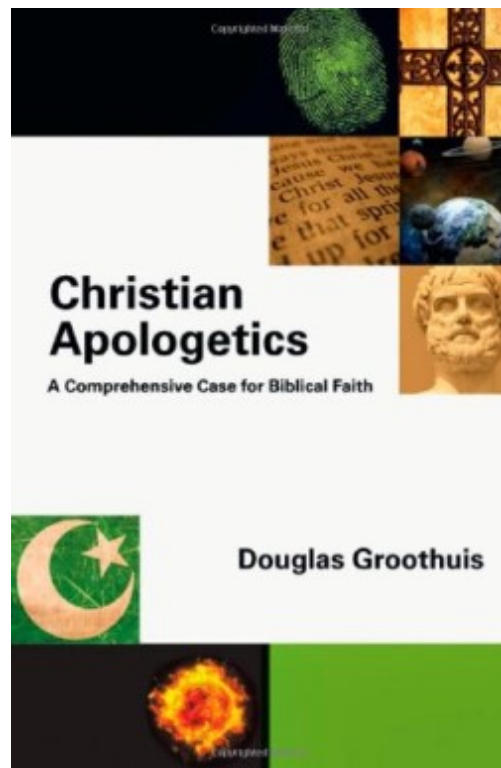
Christian Apologetics: A Comprehensive Case for Biblical Faith

Dr. Groothuis is currently working on a second edition of his Christian Apologetics textbook.

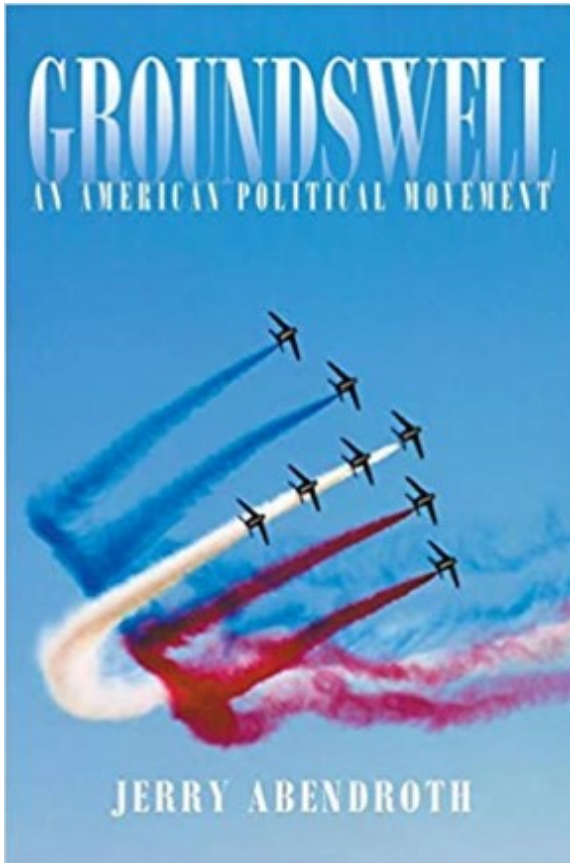

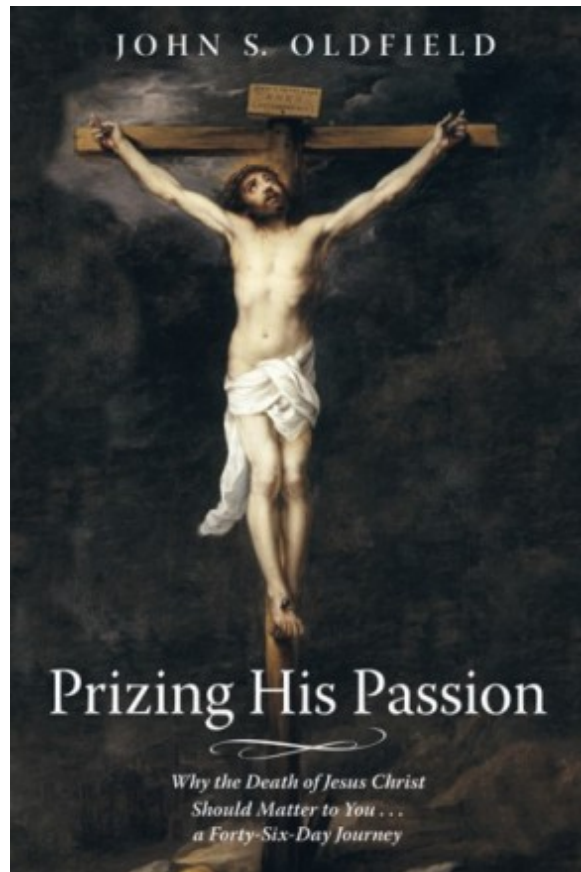

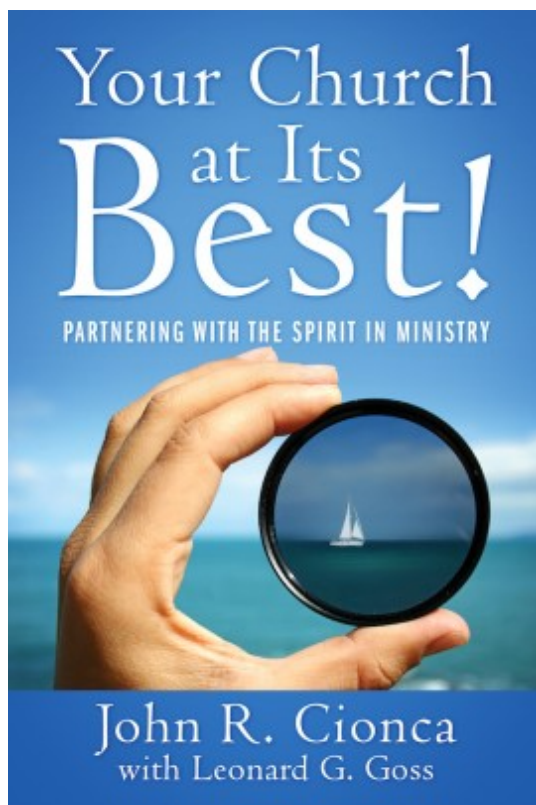
Prizing His Passion: Why the Death of Jesus Christ Should Matter to You...a Forty-Six-Day Journey

102 Fascinating Bible Studies on the New Testament

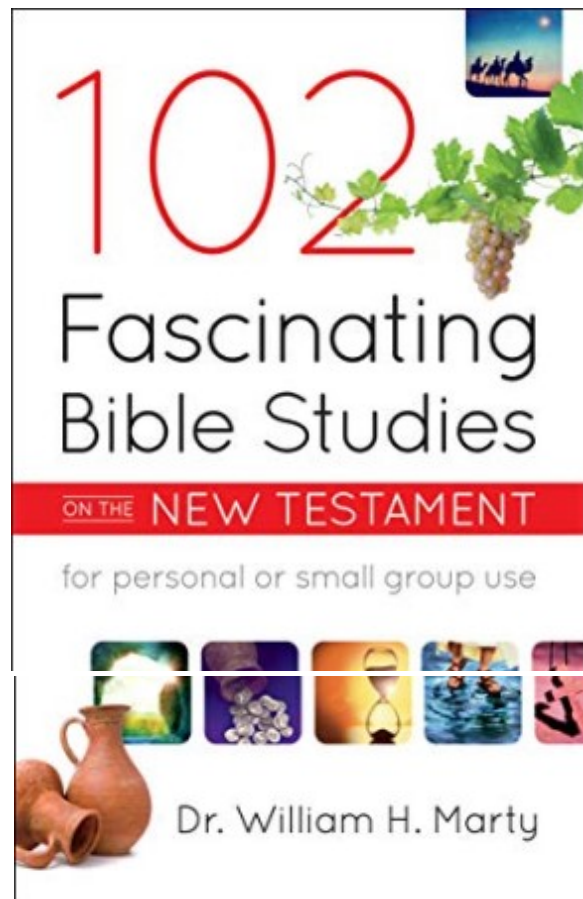

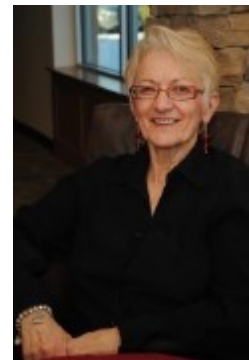
