Expand

This vision will be realized by fostering intentional relationship with pastors and church leaders in the urban context and by creating pathways to expand the presence of students of color at Denver Seminary through connecting events and conferences.

Institute of Ministerial Studies Weekend Seminars

Four weekend seminars are offered to students, alumni, and the community to equip them in a contextualized manner by providing insights on current ministry trends and leadership principles.

The Urban Initiatives embraces all people in urban Denver while focusing on black people of varying ethnic backgrounds by being an academic bridge between the Seminary and Denver's urban centers.

Enhance

Denver Seminary's Black Student Fellowship

BSF is a student led and governed body of black students that exists to enhance the overall experience of black students through support activities and services on the seminary campus.

Extend

The **Institute of Ministerial Studies** extends the educational resources of Denver Seminary into the urban context through the Lay Ministry certificate program which is transcribed by Colorado Christian University.


Lay Ministry Certificate
